TIAHA EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING MINUTES

July 8th, 2008 at Knights of Columbus, New Hope Road and Columbus Road, Raleigh, NC

Attendees: Frank Ferraro, Dale Mancuso, Victor Cononi, John Bono, Bob "Capi" Caprioli, Dave Baron, Sal "No Tomatoes" Notarmaso, Bob Vetrano, Jim Frederici.

Meeting Called To Order: 6:45pm

1. Bob V. cooked pizzas for the board meeting. Bob is trying different pizza shells to see which are best to use for the International Festival.
2. Frank F. wanted to clarify again that the correct date for the Raleigh Rescue Mission event is August 1st not August 15th. Frank is looking for volunteers to cook the meal at the Rescue Mission that morning and serve the meal at lunch time. The meal will be cooked in the Mission's kitchen. Suggested menu would be baked ziti, salad and bread.
3. Frank F. will send Jim F. the call list previously assigned to Tony Defede.
4. The golf tournament at Hedingham Golf Course to benefit the USO and Operation Bit of Home will be on August 15th. It's a Friday so there can be a shotgun start. Suggested cost will be \$45.00 per person to play. All profits will be used to benefit the USO and Operation Bit of Home. Frank F. has about \$500.00 worth of sponsors so far. Frank F. said we need 72 golfers, which would give 18 foursomes. Frank F. is asking TIAHA members to solicit sponsors. If each member could sign up just one sponsor at \$50, \$75 or \$100, then that would bring in a lot of money to donate to the USO and Operation Bit of Home. Frank F. brought up the question of food for the tournament players. Should the food be catered, or should TIAHA members make the food? Frank is leaning toward having it catered.
5. John B. brought up the subject of the Durham Bulls game for the Oxford House children. John B. is looking to lock in a date for the game in August. John B. will contact Chris Richardson at the Oxford House to obtain a head count for the numbers of kids who will be attending the Bulls game.
6. Dale M. asked: "When will TIAHA do a meal for the USO?". This would be at the USO location in the RDU airport. Dale would like to do the meal on a Wednesday. Dale said about 200 troops a day come through the USO location at RDU. Either August 20th or August 27th would be the preferred dates. Suggested menu would be pans of either baked ziti or lasagna rotolini, with and without sausage, for those who may not want to eat meat or sausage. Victor C. will contact The Healing Place near RDU airport to see if TIAHA could use their ovens for the cooking, then the food would be transported to the USO location at the airport. Victor C. suggested there may need to be two cooking shifts: a morning shift to cook food to be served around lunchtime, and a mid-afternoon cooking shift to cook the food to be served around dinner time.
7. Sal N. fell asleep during the board meeting 7:25pm. He then started snoring at about 7:32pm.
8. The International Festival will be Friday and Saturday, Sept. 5th and 6th this year. Bob V. has been trying different pizza shells. TIAHA member signup sheets will be available starting at the next General Membership meeting. The menu for the festival will be pizza, lasagna rotolini, sausage and pepper sandwiches and cannoli. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

9. Vince Conzola was attending the St. Raphael's Fair planning meeting at the same night and time as our TIAHA board meeting was in progress. The dates for the St. Raphael's Fair are Friday and Saturday, Sept. 12th and 13th. TIAHA will be manning two booths, same as last year. Both the Italian and German booths will be manned by TIAHA members. Frank F. said he would contact the Fair coordinator for St. Raphael's to make sure there is electrical power for two booths supplied, as there was power supplied for only one booth last year. The suggested menu for both booths will be: sausage and pepper sandwiches, mozzarella sticks, knockwurst, bratwurst and cannoli. Frank F. said he would look into refrigerator rental for the weekend.
10. The TIAHA family picnic will be held on Sunday, Sept. 21st. The tentative location is the Odd Fellows Lodge. Frank F. asked John B. how much the Odd Fellows will charge TIAHA for the one day rental of the lodge. John B. to report back to Frank F. on the availability of the date and the cost at the Odd Fellow Lodge.
11. Bob V. asked the board if we could ask TIAHA members to visit Vinnie Sorrentino at his home. Vinnie S. has been ill and is home bound. Members would be asked to contact Vinnie's wife, Rosemarie, to set up the day and time to visit Vinnie. John B. also asked about extending the same to Virgil Luciani as well.

Italian Criminal Begs For Jail

Naples - June 13, 2008 - An Italian crook begged to go back to jail after telling wardens life behind bars was better than living with his wife again.

Prison bosses had freed Luigi Folliero, 45, to serve the second year of his two-year sentence for theft under house arrest.

But after just two days at home he fled back to Ponte San Leonardo jail, near Naples, and pleaded to go back in his old cell because he could not stand being at home with his wife.

He told wardens: "She never stops moaning and nagging."

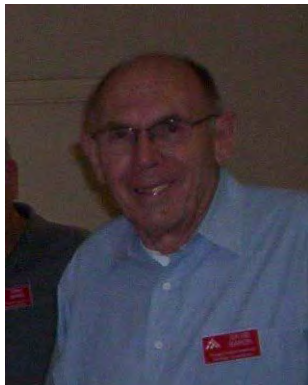

Rome - June 23, 2008 - After a week pushing for a change in the law to halt his corruption trial, Italy's prime minister, Silvio Berlusconi, set his sights even higher at the weekend by demanding the Catholic church kill off a rule which stops him taking communion because he is divorced and remarried.

Evidently on a roll and wearing a white panama hat, a relaxed-looking Berlusconi sat in the front row at a service in a church near his Sardinian villa on Saturday as the bishop approached the congregation to offer communion.

"When are you going to change this rule that stops me taking communion?" Berlusconi asked the startled bishop, who had been planning to move swiftly past the prime minister without stopping to pop a wafer in his mouth.

The Catholic church considers a religious marriage unbreakable, as stated in the Bible, meaning Catholics getting a civil divorce cannot then remarry in church, unless an annulment is granted by the church.

Anyone opting instead for a civil wedding second time round can be denied communion, including Berlusconi, who has three children from his second marriage to the actor Veronica Lario.

Until now, the Italian prime minister and media mogul has remained an unwavering supporter of the Vatican's policy of promoting family values and attacking single-sex unions. Berlusconi showed up at last year's church-run Family Day demonstration in Rome, prompting critics to joke that he was well qualified to do so since he had so many families of his own.

Earlier this month, after kissing Pope Benedict on the hand at a meeting at the Vatican, Berlusconi said: "We are on the church's side." He added: "The outlook of my government cannot but please the Pope and the church."

By Saturday, after a week spent seeking to suspend his trial for allegedly bribing the British lawyer David Mills while preparing a blanket law which would give himself immunity from all prosecution, Berlusconi perhaps thought it was time to try his luck with the church.

The embarrassed bishop, Sebastiano Sanguinetti, hinted he could have worked something out in private with Berlusconi, but he was not about to provoke a scandal by giving him communion in front of watching journalists.

"I told him he could take the matter to a higher level, given that he has just been received by the Pope at the Vatican," Sanguinetti told reporters.

But in a speech made via satellite to a Canadian church congress on the eucharist yesterday, Benedict appeared to hold firm. "We must do all in our power to receive (communion) with a pure heart," he said, adding, in an apparent reference to remarried Catholics.

"Those who cannot have communion due to their situation will nonetheless find strength in their desire for it and by going to mass," the Pope said.

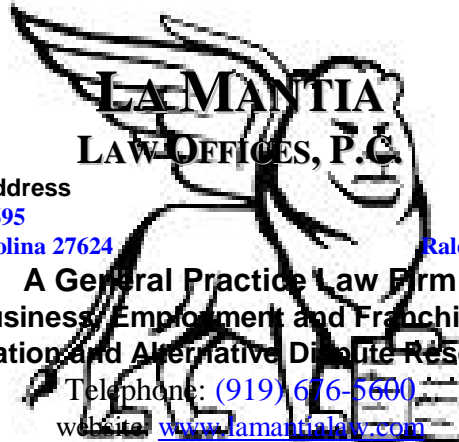

The boss is getting worried that he's going to actually have to hire this Italian, so he says, 'All right, last question..... Same rules again, but represent the number 100.'

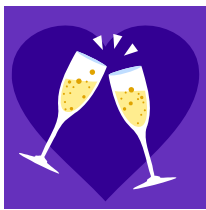
The Italian stares into space some more, then he picks up the picture again and makes a little mark at the base of each tree and says, 'Ere you go. One hundred.'
